The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, April 8. The opening prayer given by Elroy Schumacher.

Keith Carmichael shared a devotion at the beginning of the meeting. Matthew 16 was the scripture reference for this devotion about "Questions of Jesus". Keith referenced several questions throughout this chapter including Matt. 16:8-11: ⁸Aware of their discussion, Jesus asked, "You of little faith, why are you talking among yourselves about having no bread? ⁹Do you still not understand? Don't you remember the five loaves for the five thousand, and how many basketfuls you gathered? ¹⁰ Or the seven loaves for the four thousand, and how many basketfuls you gathered? ¹¹ How is it you don't understand that I was not talking to you about bread? Keith discussed that often times we humans take things so literally—purely in the physical realm—when we should be looking beyond this into the spiritual realm. How important it is not to let "distractions" deter us from keeping our eyes on the Lord!

- Training Center Christian School of Garden City and New Hope Christian School of Smithville were accepted into the conference.

- A committee was formed to look at the process for selecting the number of individual awards given, with recommendations to be presented at the summer MoKan meeting.
- Another committee was formed to update and develop sportsmanship standards and consequences that all schools will follow. A proposal from this committee will also be presented at the summer meeting.
- Clinton Chamber of Commerce hosted a tour of the Civic Center and other benefits Clinton has to offer to conference President Tammy Atcheson and Vice-President Jon Stark. The conference has decided to host the JV MoKan Conference Volleyball Tournament in Clinton on Sat., Oct. 5 and Varsity Volleyball Tournament in Clinton on Sat., Oct. 19. The JH Volleyball Tournament will continue to be held at Fort Scott on Oct. 12. Special thanks to the hard work and professionalism of the Chamber!
- The MoKan Conference Track Meet will be held at Eldorado Springs on Monday, May 6, with a rainout date of Tuesday May 7.
